Per Town of Franklin Resolution 23-07, The Town Council has established the Master Plan Update Committee to update the 2013 town-wide Master Plan.

The Committee will be charged to:

- Review the current Master Plan and existing planning documents, data and achievements;
- Identify the key issues facing the community in the next ten years;
- Assist in the identification of existing conditions and conduct trends analysis;
- Recommend goals and objectives related to Franklin's future;
- Develop a clear action plan for the Town of Franklin; and
- Make a final report to the Planning Board within 18 months from the date of ratification of the Committee members.



CIRCULATION (TRANSPORTATION)





Issues:

- Pursue solutions and countermeasures to address safety at high crash locations
- Traffic and congestion during peak hours on Route
 140 and near schools

- Expansion of regional bus service for seniors
- Seek infrastructure improvement grant funding





COMMUNITY FACILITIES & SERVICES





Issues:

- High number of paramedic trips to out-of-town hospitals reduces local level-of-service
- Staffing increases in Town Hall
- Mental health training and resources for paramedics

Opportunities:

- Continue the planning process for a new police station & the reuse of Davis Thayer School
- Continue funding for sustainable technology
- Collaboration within school district, across individual schools










- 1. Which Open Spaces should we prioritize when looking at improving accessibility?


