TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE

I wish to submit my final annual report for the Office of the Town Clerk for the year ending June 30, 2015.

Busy, Busy, Busy is how I have begun my report for the past years, and yes... once again, I must report the same.

I'm entering my 31st year as Town Clerk and I still enjoy my job as much as when I was first elected in 1985. I have seen a variety of changes throughout my years as Town Clerk and am now announcing that I will be retiring after the November/2015 Biennial Town Election.

School Visit

As always, I continue my visits to the second grade classes at various schools. I have also added museum visits and the students really enjoy this. They are able to see some of the history of Franklin during their visits which prompts many question. When something is visual it creates a special interest rather than just talking about it. This is most enjoyable for me and the students are very receptive to my "words on Franklin". They always love to hear about the history of Franklin and how things were many years ago. They are amazed how Franklin has changed. I think it is important for the student to understand a little history of their Town. I usually begin by asking the student if they think Franklin is a city or a town and you guessed it....they answer "Town". After my explanation of how we are a "City known as the Town of Franklin" I invite them to go home and quiz their families!

Franklin High School, Davis Thayer, Keller/Sullivan and Parmenter Schools were just some of the visitors at the Franklin Historical Museum. I had the opportunity to visit with them and show them some of the many articles that I usually speak about when I visit the schools. To have them at the museum is just wonderful. They come up with so many interesting questions and are fascinated to see the Indian arrowheads, old tools, a television from 1949 and so many other things.

Growing

The Office of the Town Clerk, along with all departments, continues to feel the growing pains. I remember growing up in Franklin when it was a "small/country/farm community of about 7,000 people and everyone knew everyone...

Today, we have 33,590 residents and we are considered a bedroom community. This is evident when you see the parking lots at the area train stations and you see people boarding the train to go to Boston for their jobs.

This office services residents, along with all Town departments, commissions and committees. All Departments are now open until 6:00p.m on Wednesday evening. The late hours continue to be well received by all residents, especially, those residents working outside of Franklin and couples planning marriage.

Population

At the close of the census, we announced that the figures for the 2015 census were available. Total population is now 33,590.

The following are some past population figures that I reported over the past years and have found them to be a helpful tool for those doing population reports either for school projects or businesses. This shows the rate of growth that Franklin has encountered over the past 30 years.

The population of Franklin seems to always go up even though the economy has had its ups and downs. There were more houses vacant and now they are beginning to become occupied. The new house market is increasing showing the residents are looking for new along with affordable/deals on older homes.

We have been building some assisted living residences and this is bringing our population up. Most times these dwellings will not influence our school system.

I have continued to update our records on a daily basis, adding new residents as soon as we have taken off the previous residents in that household. Our office works to record those moving into vacant properties throughout the year. We continue to see homeowners converting two family homes back into one family to fit their needs rather than moving to a new location. We have also noticed that families are taking in relatives and sharing homes. This was a practice back many years ago and now we are seeing it again. You will see in the Zoning Board decisions that residents have taken advantage of the "in-law" bylaw once again this year.

Underground storage of gasoline permits are the same as last year with a total of 23 and 13 hazardous material permits. No new certificates have been filed with this office by the Fire Department during 2014.

Planning /Appeal Board Applications

Planning Board and Board of Appeal applications begin and end in the Office of the Town Clerk. Elsewhere in this report you will find our index of applicants/decisions during the year 2014. All applications and decisions are permanent record and may be researched at any time through the Town Clerk's office. With the changes in personnel that seems to occur on a frequent basis, it is important to have continuity in the Clerk's position so as to trace background information on a particular variance or subdivision not only for departments but for residents/applicants.

Responsibilities of the Clerk's Office

Sometimes people will ask. "What exactly does the Town Clerk's position consist of?" The office of the Town Clerk traditionally, and to a large degree presently, can be compared to a hub around which the wheel of local government revolves. The spokes of the wheel represent the various board, department, commissions and committees within the government to which the Town Clerk relates in a direct way. The rim of the wheel represents the many segments of State and County Government from which many of The Town Clerk's official duties and responsibilities stem. Although the Town Clerk is visible to the public more than any Town Official, sometimes the duties are hidden from the public and hence go unnoticed... *we're not just that little office that issues dog licenses!!*

Code of Franklin

The Town of Franklin Code Book is maintained and updated through this office, both in hard copy, computer and on the web at www.franklin.ma.us.

This book contains all the rules, regulations, by-laws and acts of the Town. The code has been helpful, not only to department managers and councilors, but also to attorneys, engineers and contractors since it contains all information relating to their daily work.

Town Clerk Directory

Our "best seller" is the *Directory of Town, State and County Officials*. This is available here in the Clerk's office for the unbeatable price of zero! This booklet has been a very useful tool to employers, committees, managers and residents. Other publications available in the Clerk's office are Subdivision and Zoning Regulations, Street Directories and Resident Listing Books and Street Maps.

We update the street map directory on a regular basis with the assistance of the DPW GIS department. This book enables residents to find a street in Town a little easier since we have added many streets over the past ten years. These books are for sale for \$3.00.

Record Retention Schedule

I have continued to keep our records in the best possible order as mandated through the Secretary of State's office. All of our books are bound, microfilmed and stored in the Town Clerk's vault each year. This is the history of Franklin and its' residents and I take pride in maintaining a filing system that continues the safety of each volume.

Vital Records

Certified records of birth, deaths and marriage records are available through the Clerk's office, copied on safety paper at a charge of \$6.00 each. The State is looking into changing the price for all vital records. The Clerk's Association is against this as it will increase the cost of a vital record to \$26.00 each with \$6.00 going to the State. I strongly believe this is unfair to the residents and hope that the Mass. And City Clerks will fight to oppose this. As a note, when you need a copy of your birth record, remember that it is always filed in the town where your parents were living at the time of your birth, the hospital community and the Office of Vital Records in Boston, MA. Note: For a passport you need a long form certified copy of your birth certificate.

Dog Licensing

We have over 4267 dogs here in Franklin, a little down from last year. Licensing dogs is very time consuming because many people feel, "Why do I need to license my dog?" They feel it is not a priority. We license dog mainly to be sure that they are up to date on their rabies vaccination. Just think of the procedure that one must go through if they receive a dog bite...a series of shots that are not very pleasant if proof cannot be obtained that the dog was vaccinated properly. Unfortunately, if we did not require proof of this, some would let it slide by only

to create problems down the line. It is sad but we have seen this happen. Licenses are due by March 31st of each year with a late fine of \$25.00 added to the tag fee after July 1st. **Please...License Your Dogs!**

Conclusion

You will note that my report does not change much from year to year. The stats are changed but the duties remain pretty much the same since the position is covered under the MA General Laws.

I'm sure you will agree that our office is certainly a very busy one! We find so often that people will call our office first for information when needing assistance and we always welcome their calls and will try to set them in the right direction. It's nice to know that people feel comfortable calling the Clerk's office for assistance... not only in Franklin, but also throughout the Nation this is a similar response method. Having lived in Town certainly helps when researching questions.

In conclusion, I would like to take a moment to thank Teresa Burr, Administrative Assistant, Mona Ghiringhelli PT Clerical Asst., Lois D'Amico, PT Data Entry Assistant, and Joanne Bird, PT Clerical Asst. for their continued support and cooperation throughout the past year. I would also like to thank each department manager and their staff for their continued support during all my years as Town Clerk.

I will be retiring from this wonderful position after 31 years. There has not been one day that I dreaded coming to work! Each day has been a wonderful experience meeting new people and assisting them. One of the highlights that I recall is the day when a resident came in to say goodbye to me as they were moving out of Town. They told me that they met me first and now that they were moving just wanted to say "Goodbye" and "Thank You" for all the assistance that I had given them. What a wonderful compliment! This happened quite a few times.

I would like to end my final report by thanking the citizens of Franklin for their continued support and confidence. Thank you for the privilege of serving you for 31 years. It has been a wonderful experience.

A BY-LAW TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF FRANKLIN BY ADDING A NEW CHAPTER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE FRANKLIN TOWN COUNCIL that Chapter 65, Collection Containers is added in its entirety as follows to the Code of the Town of Franklin.

CHAPTER 65 COLLECTION CONTAINERS

65.1 Purpose

The purpose to this by law is to regulate the location, siting, and maintenance of collection containers for used clothing, household goods, books and other items to protect public health and safety, including preventing rodents and vermin and blight.

65.2 Definitions

Collection Containers: Any bin or other container where a member of the public may donate or otherwise dispose of used clothing, shoes, household goods, books or other items.

Charitable Organization: A duly-organized and existing legal entity which has received a formal designation under Section 501C(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code and maintains an office or facility within the town.

House of Worship: Property containing a building which serves as the principal place of worship for a local congregation of a duly-established and generally recognized religious denomination.

Dumpster/Dumpster-type: A container with a hinged lid on top designed to be emptied by mechanically lifting and inverting it.

Uncollectible Goods or Item: Any goods or item, the collection of which is not specifically authorized in Section 65.3.

65.3 Permitted Collection Containers

Collection containers for used clothing, shoes, household goods, and books, only are permitted within the Town and only in the locations specified in this bylaw; collection containers for other goods or items and at other locations are prohibited.

A collection container shall be fully enclosed with a pull-down, self-closing door located on the front section. It shall have a footprint of no more than twenty-five(25) square feet and a height of no more than six feet, measured from the bottom edge to the top edge of the front and rear

sections. Dumpster-type containers are prohibited, regardless of dimensions.

Any existing collection container for uncollectible goods or item or which does not comply with specifications contained in this section shall be removed within thirty (30) days following the effective date of this bylaw; any existing collection container located in a non-permitted location or improperly sited shall be removed and/or relocated within ninety (90) days following the effective date of this bylaw.

65.4 Exclusions

This bylaw shall not apply to;

- a. Commercial trash dumpsters,
- b. Town of Franklin trash and recycling totes.

65.5 Permitted Locations

Collection containers are p-permitted in the following locations:

a. Private property located within the Industrial District, as defined in Chapter 185 of the Franklin Town Code and designated on the Town's official zoning map; a collection container is not permitted on an unimproved or vacant lot and no more than four (4) containers are permitted on an improved lot.

b. Up to two collection containers may be placed and maintained at a House of Worship for the particular religious denomination's own charitable work.

c. A charitable organization may place and maintain up to two collection containers on its property for its own charitable work.

d. The Town Recycling Center, in the discretion of the Director of Public Works.

65.6 Permit Required

Placement of a collection container pursuant to Section 65.5(a) shall require written application to and issuance of a permit from the Building Administrator; all existing collection containers which otherwise comply with this bylaw shall comply with this subsection within thirty (30) days following the effective date of this bylaw.

65.7 Permit Application Contents

The application pursuant to Section 65.6 shall include:

- a. Legal name, principal business address and legal identification of applicant.
- b. Name, address, telephone number and email address for contact person.
- c. Legal address of property where each container is to be located, together with a sketch plan showing compliance with the requirements of Section 65.8.
- d. Written permission from property owner, including information for owner required of applicant in (a) and (b).
- e. Description of collection container.
- f. Listing of collectible items.
- g. Pick-up, inspection, and maintenance schedules.

65.8 Siting

a. Collection containers shall be sited so as not to obstruct traffic sight lines or distance and not to otherwise impede the flow of traffic or pose a safety hazard to pedestrians.

b. Collection containers shall not be sited within any setback or buffer required by Chapter 185, Town's Zoning Bylaw.

c. Collection containers shall be placed upon a concrete pad or asphalt paved surface.

d. Collection containers shall not utilize or obstruct any parking space required for minimum zoning compliance or any space designated for trash dumpster placement or snow storage on an approved site plan.

65.9 Maintenance

a. Collection container shall be kept clean and in good repair and its site shall be clean and free of debris at all times. Without limiting this requirement, no container overflow and no disposal of uncollectible goods or items shall be permitted.

65.10 Penalties for Non-Compliance

a. Placement of collection container of uncollectible goods or items or which does not comply with specification contained in Section 65.3 or placement of a collection container in a non-permitted location: \$300; each day shall constitute a separate offenses.

b. Failure to obtain a permit for collection container where one is required: \$100; each day shall constitute a separate offense.

c. All other, including but not limited to non-compliance with requirements of Section 65.8 and 65.9:

First offense: \$50

Second offense: \$100

Third and subsequent offense: \$300

In the case of continuing violation, each day shall constitute a separate offense.

Property owner and collection container owner shall each be responsible for compliance with this bylaw and shall be liable for any violation.

65.11 Enforcement

In addition to the Franklin Police Department, this by law may be enforced by the Franklin Building Commissioner and the Franklin Board of Health Agent.

WHEREAS, in recognition of this, the statute provides that the governing body may make an express classification of uncompensated volunteers serving on town boards, commissions and committees as "special municipal employees", with the exception of the governing body itself.

WHEREAS, by Resolution 12-15, dated March 7, 2012, the Franklin Town Council made said classification for the Citizens' Committee, but by Resolution 14-47 dated July 9, 2014 the Council changed the Citizens' Committee's name to "Franklin Advisory Committee" and modified its mission.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Town Council of the Town of Franklin hereby makes an express classification of the members of the Franklin Advisory Committee as "special town employees", under the terms and provisions of G.L. Chapter 268A as provided in Section 1, Paragraph (n) of said statute.

WHEREAS, the purpose of this order is to comply with statutory requirements and/or to confirm title in the Town and no land damages are therefore anticipated, and
