Burning Permits are available for burning brush from January 15 through May 1of each year. In order to obtain a permit to burn, citizen must visit the Fire Department Headquarters, 40 West Central Street or apply on-line. There is no fee for the permit which is good throughout the burning season. Below are listed several guidelines and requirements for burning.

- Specific conditions for open burning
 - Must be on the same land (property) the debris was generated.
 - Must be greater than 75' from any dwelling.
 - o Between 10 AM and 4 PM
 - Without causing a nuisance (Causing a nuisance is grounds for permit revocation)
- Prohibited Open Burning
 - o Commercial burning
 - Institutional burning
 - o Burning at landfills/transfer stations/recycling centers
 - o Demolition debris
- Commercial Burning Includes
 - Golf course
 - Clearing home lots
- Institutional Burning Includes
 - Municipal properties
 - o Commercial properties
- Agricultural Burning
 - o Hours same as residential
 - Property must be 5 acres or more
 - o Property must generate \$ 500 or more annually
 - Property must be involved in the cultivation of food stuff or the raising of livestock.
 - Property must be under the provisions of MGL Chapter 61 A.
 - Nurseries are considered agricultural properties but may only burn materials generated on-site.
