SUBCOMMITTEE REPORTS:

- **TREASURER:** Phyllis reported a balance of about \$3700. The commission only spent about \$300 since the last report. Mary indicated she would get an exact report from the treasurer and also stated that the Commission has received permission to use donation money for speakers.
- **ARCHIVIST Rowan Lowell**
 - >Shelves have been set up in basement and more may be set up in future but now evaluating how much space is left over.
 - >Almost done with cataloging, hope to start deaccessioning in January
 - > Cataloging has been moving in shifts so that about 70 percent is now on Google drive
 - > After everything is accounted for, will add finding aids etc. and develop subject files
 - donations, downtown images, etc.
 - >Hope eventually to get iPad or something similar to make it easier for patrons to locate items.
 - > In response to a question from Mary, Rowan said she can provide a tutorial and probably eventually a static version of the catalog online...depending on what the web site can support.
- **SSSS:** Joe Landry will speak on Jan 14 about Thompson Press and nearby Soap Factory. Mary is looking to fill two more SSSS. Slots. Alan agreed to talk about history of Valentine cards for Feb SSS on Feb 10
- **CPC Report:** Phyllis said still no CPC meeting scheduled. CPC expects to received \$313,000 from state.
