About 65 residents attended and were please to hear Representative Jeffrey Roy talk about the work he is doing in the State House for the betterment of the Town of Franklin. # OLD BUSINESS

- Norfolk HA Update We have received the Execution for Possession on one unit that we have been in court for about 6 times in the past 2 years. That tenant will be leaving shortly or the Sherriff's Department will be called to handle the matter. A second resident household is in process of vacating due to a NTQ. This tenant vacates prior to having to present the case in court.
- FISH 101156 The Air Source Heat Pumps have not yet been received for this project but are expected within a week. One tenant continues to post negative accusation and lies on Facebook but we are unable to respond due to confidentiality regulations.

# NEW BUSINESS

Management Services Agreement (MCA) Amendment – An Amendment to the MCA was discussed and considered. Motion is made by Commissioner Kepple to approve the MSA Amendment that increases the contract sum by 9% to \$72,948.25 beginning January 1, 2023. Commissioner Lennon seconds the motion. All in favor. So voted.

- New Maintenance Hire Thomas Mosley has joined the FHA Team as a part time maintenance man. He will begin on October 19<sup>th</sup>.
- FISH #101160, Sewer Line Certificate of Final Completion Motion is made by Commissioner Kepple, second by Commissioner Lennon to approve the Certificate of Finial Completion for FISH 101160. All in favor. So voted.
- Add to the Agenda Motion is made by Commissioner Kepple, second by Commissioner Lennon to add two topics to the Agenda. Health Incentive and Resident Service Coordinator (NOFA) All in favor. So voted.
- Health Incentive Motion is made by Commissioner Kepple, second by Commissioner Lennon to authorize the payment of a \$1000 Health Incentive to one employee that did not take health insurance for the past year. This saved the FHA almost \$20,000. All in favor. So voted.
- Resident Service Coordinator (RSC) Application for Funding The Norfolk HA hired a RSC on January 1, 2022 who serves all of NHA residents and FHA family residents. This program has been very helpful to residents and a worthy compliment to the staff of both agencies. In order to continue the services, we need to submit a application for funding. We need Board approval from both agencies. The application is requesting an additional \$10,000 per year for the position and to fund the position for 5 years 2023-2027 with a total request of \$300,000. Motion is made by Commissioner Kepple, second by Commissioner Lennon to authorize the submission of the application on behalf of the FHA. All in favor. So voted.
