



TRANSPORTATION 101: Elders and disabled individuals in Franklin can receive handicapped-accessible transportation through **GATRA**, the **Greater Attleboro Taunton Regional Transit Authority**. Dial-A-Ride service can be arranged by calling **Kiessling Transit**, at (800) 698-7676 and reservations are taken Monday-Friday from 8:30 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. If you are over 60 years old or disabled, call to enroll for this service.

<u>EMERGENCY KITS AVAILABLE</u> to help elders prepare for a natural disaster. Kits include batteries, bottled water, a flashlight and some non-perishable food. Kits are provided by the **Franklin Food Pantry**, the **Neighbor Brigade** and **Franklin Council on Aging** with financial support from the **Franklin Rotary Club.** Call to learn more.

<u>CAN I STILL CHANGE MY MEDICARE PLAN?</u> The Medicare Open Enrollment period has ended, but you may be allowed to change plan. For 2016, the Tufts Medicare Preferred Plan was designated as a 5-star Plan by Medicare. This means that Medicare Beneficiaries may enroll in, or change to, one of the Tufts Medicare Preferred Plans at any time up until Nov. 30, 2016. This is a great opportunity if you missed the Open Enrollment deadline. For those with a **Medicare Advantage Plan**: you can leave your plan and switch to Original Medicare up until Feb. 14 but you <u>cannot</u> switch to another Medicare Advantage Plan. If you drop your Medicare Advantage plan during this period, you will be able to join a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan to add drug coverage. Your Original Medicare coverage and your prescription drug coverage will begin the first day of the month after your enrollment. You may also add a supplement (Medigap) at this time.

FUNDING FOR HOME REPAIRS & FUEL ASSISTANCE: Franklin has funding to help low and moderate income property owners make repairs to their properties and provide fuel assistance. See below:

Help with Home Repairs for eligible owners of residential properties who can receive up to \$35,000 per unit to make needed repairs. Assistance will be provided in the form of zero-interest deferred payment loans. No repayment is required unless the property is sold or refinanced. At the end of 15 years the loan is forgiven and becomes a grant.

Additional Fuel Assistance Funding provides additional assistance once the household has used up its LI-HEAP benefits. Franklin residents who are over-income for the LIHEAP fuel assistance program may qualify for assistance under the Community Development Program's higher income limits.

Applications for both programs are available at the Senior Center.
