QUESTION 2 LAW PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION

Do you approve of a law summarized below, on which no vote was taken by the Senate or the House of Representatives on or before May 2, 2018?

SUMMARY

SUMMARY

This proposed law would create a citizens commission to consider and recommend potential amendments to the United States Constitution to establish that corporations do not have the same Constitution of rights as human beings and that campaign contributions and expenditures may be regulated.

Any resident of Massachusetts who is a United States citizen would be able to apply for appointment to the 15-member commission, and members would serve without compensation. The Governor, the Secretary of the Commonwealth, the state Altomey General, the Speaker of the state House of Representatives, and the President of the state Secretar would early appoint there members of the commission and the resident of the state Secretar would seek to ensure that, the commission would be required to research and take testimory, and then issue a report regarding (1) the impact of political spending in Massachusetts, (2) ary limitations on the states ability to regulate corporations and other entities in light of Supreme Court decisions that allow corporations to assert certain constitutional rights; (3) recommendations for constitutional amendments (4) an analysis of constitutional amendments introduced to Congress; and (5) recommendations for advancing proposed amendments to the United States Constitution.

The commission would be solvied to the state Copen Meeting Law and Public Records Law. The commissions' first report would be due December 31,

The commission would be subject to the state Open Meeting Law and Public Records Law. The commission's first report would be due December 31, 2019, and the Secretary of the Commonwealth would be required to deliver the commission's report to the state Legislature, the United States Congress, and the

President of the United States.

The proposed law slates the distribution of its parts were declared invalid, the other parts would stay in effect. The proposed law would take effect on January 1, 2019.

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QUESTION 3 REFERENDUM ON AN EXISTING LAW

SUMMARY

This taw adds gender identity to the tist of prohibited grounds for discrimination in places of public accommodation, resort, or amusement. Such grounds also include race, color, religious creed, national origin, see, disability, and ancestry. A place of public accommodation, resort or amusement is defined as existing law as any place that is open to and acceptor is religious for explorating entering law as a price price point on an existing take as a presson's sincerety hald gender-related identity, appearance, or behavior, whether or not it is different from that

traditionally associated with the person's physiclogy or assigned sex at birth.

This law prohibits discrimination based on gender identity in a person's admission to or treatment in any place of public accommodation. The law requires any such place that has separate areas for males and terrales (such as restrooms) to allow access to and full use of those areas consistent with a person's gender definition in the control of the con

This faw directs the state Commission Against Discrimination to adopt rules or policies and make recommendations to carry out this faw. The law also directs the state Attorney General to issue regulations or guidance on reterring for legal action any person who asserts gender identify for an improper purpose.

The provisions of this law governing access to places of public accommodation are effective as of October 1, 2016. The remaining provisions are effective as of

A YES VOTE would keep in place the current law, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of gender identity in places of public accommodation.

A NO VOTE would repeal this provision of the public accommodation law.
