Pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws Ch. 131, s.40 (Wetlands Protection Act), the Franklin Conservation Commission will hold a Hybrid Public Hearing on Thursday, February 12, 2026 at 7:06 PM on a Notice of Intent filed by Russell E. Waldron of Applied Ecological Services, Norfolk, MA on behalf of Michael Davis, Franklin, MA. The applicant is proposing to remove the existing pool and construct a detached garage. Approximately 850 Square Feet (SF) of proposed work is within the 100-foot Buffer Zone to Bordering Vegetated Wetlands (BVW), specifically within the 50- to 100-foot Buffer Zone to BVW.

The Project is located on 670 King Street, Map 313, Lot 65, within the Single Family III Zoning District.

The hearing will provide an open forum for the discussion. This meeting will be done remotely via the "ZOOM" platform and "In-person" in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building, 355 East Central Street. Residents can visit the Town Website (www.franklinma.gov) and click on the Town Calendar for up to date information on how to access the meeting.

All records and files for this project can be viewed at the Conservation Office located on the first floor of the Franklin Municipal Building.

Any person or organization so wishing will be afforded an opportunity to be heard. The hearing location is accessible to persons with physical disabilities.
