5. Free Cash Overview & 10-year History/Administration:

The free cash balance has been certified at 3,726,972 for 7/1/2018. This is the highest in the last 10 years with an average of 2,866,972. Free cash is used primarily used to fund the purchase of capital items and certain other items defined in the fiscal policies of the town as shown below:

Note: Withdrawals from both Water and Sewer Enterprise funds leave approximately \$1,000,000 in each fund for future needs and emergencies.

7. Water Enterprise Borrowing Authorization:

The administration will be asking the town council for authorization to borrow \$5,000,000 as we did 5 years ago to continue the replacement of water mains. The water mains needing replacement will reviewed in conjunction with the recently update pavement management program. Roads needing the most work as well as water main replacement will be done first thus allowing both to be done in the most cost effective manner. Payments are made on the borrowing are made from the Water Enterprise Fund.

8. FY19 Budget Update:

The budget expenses continue to rise at a rate that is out stripping the rise in revenue, the potential for measures to raise the needed revenue will need to be considered soon. It will be up to the voters to decide the level of service that they are willing to fund.

9. OPEB Update:

The current OPEB obligation as of June 30, 2018 is \$74,059,736. The town continues to fund the OPEB trust fund by budgeting \$550,000 plus 10% of the free cash. It is the consensus that at some point the state must step in and fix the issue. It is a stated legislative policy but never is addressed.

10. Risk Assessment Update:

The recently completed outside Risk Assessment review showed that the town is in very good shape. The issue is primarily related to documenting the procedures that are in place and are being done. Many procedures just need to be dusted off and updated. A plan to make sure procedures are updated is being put in place.

<u>11. Fiscal Policies Review:</u>

The Fiscal Policies under which the town operates have been modified slightly as follows.

- Starting in FY20 add \$100,000 each year to the Property and Projects Stabilization account.
- Starting in FY20 add \$100,000 to the Open Space Stabilization account up to a maximum balance of \$2,000,000.
- Establish a policy for revenue related to the sale of marijuana in the Town of Franklin for these purposes
 - One Time Capital Expenditures.
 - Town and School Buildings.
 - Public infrastructure such as roads, parking lots and engineering and design of public infrastructure.
 - Open space purchases and recreation investments.
 - Funds will not be used for ongoing operating budget expenditures.
- Roads/sidewalks/infrastructure

- Starting in FY19 appropriate \$600,000 in the annual budget and increase it yearly by \$50,000
- Use free cash (\$500,000) and Hotel Tax (\$575,000) for roads unless there is another capital need.
