# Book Talk with Author Jeanette Scales, Saturday, April 14, 10:00 a.m.

Please join us to welcome local author Jeanette Scales as she discusses her books, *Boxes, Maria*, and *Caged*. Each book of the historical fiction trilogy can stand alone, but together they explore the adventures of a Massachusetts family who encounter a German Saboteur in WWII, test a draconian MA law in 1964, and face a wrongful imprisonment for murder in Tuscany, Italy in '65. Jeanette will talk about her research, particularly of the historical aspects of *Boxes*, and about her writing experience.
