New Museum Pass

The Franklin Public Library now has a subscription to the Zoo New England Pass! Zoo New England operates Franklin Park Zoo, a 72-acre site nestled in Boston's historic Franklin Park, and the Stone Zoo, located on a 26-acre site near Spot Pond reservoir in Stoneham, MA. In addition to animals, both zoos are engaged in wildlife and conservation programs, research, and education.

This pass admits 6 people at \$9.00 per adult and \$6.00 per child. It is valid for general daytime admission to Franklin Park Zoo or Stone Zoo.
