FRANKLIN PUBLIC LIBRARY ADDS FILM STREAMING SERVICE, KANOPY

With Kanopy, Franklin Public Library Patrons Will Have Access to more than 30,000 Films, For Free!

The popular on-demand film streaming service Kanopy is now available for free at the Franklin Public Library. Library card holders can access Kanopy and sign up to start streaming films on instantly by visiting http://franklinma.kanopy.com/. Films can be streamed from any computer, television, mobile device or platform by downloading the Kanopy app for iOS, Android, AppleTV, Chromecast or Roku.

Offering what the New York Times calls "a garden of cinematic delights," Kanopy showcases more than 30,000 of the world's best films, including award-winning documentaries, rare and hard-to-find titles, film festival

favorites, indie and classic films, and world cinema with collections from Kino Lorber, Music Box Films, Samuel Goldwyn, The Orchard, The Great Courses, PBS and thousands of independent filmmakers.

With the motto of "thoughtful entertainment," Kanopy provides Franklin Public Library patrons with access to films of unique social and cultural value; films that are often difficult or impossible to access elsewhere, and programming that features diversity, with a wide array of foreign language films and films on race, and current affairs.

The Kanopy collection includes indie hits like <u>Hunt For</u>
<u>the Wilderpeople</u> and <u>2 Days in Paris</u>, classic
masterpieces like <u>Aguirre</u>, <u>the Wrath of God</u> and <u>Seven</u>
<u>Samurai</u>, and award-winning documentaries like the
2017 Oscar®-nominated <u>I Am Not Your Negro</u> and
Sundance Film Festival winner <u>Mother of George</u>.

Kanopy was founded in 2008 by CEO Olivia Humphrey as an educational tool for colleges and universities. More than 5 million Kanopy users stream the most acclaimed movies and documentaries from award-winning filmmakers, and experience the best in independent, classic film, and world cinema.

Adult Programs

Dancing Into the Light: a spiritual journey of healing Book Talk with Author Arlyn Hope Halpern, Tuesday, June 5, 6:30 p.m.

Dancing Into the Light is a heartwarming memoir that captures one woman's transformative journey of self-discovery by making peace with a family at once extremely dysfunctional, yet oddly endearing. As a child, her troubling interaction with her depressed mother coexisted with the affection she held for her happy-go-lucky father. With little guidance from either parent, Arlyn was left to fend for herself.

A series of fateful events, from taking off in the family car at age twelve to exotic dancing in a carnival, uprooted Arlyn from this childhood world and into a progressive boarding school. Later she travelled to Israel in the aftermath of the Six Day War. There she fell in love with a Swedish man and moved to his native land.

A meeting with a college professor and their subsequent marriage

set Arlyn down the path of Buddhist practice. Making a pilgrimage to India, she received teachings from Tibetan Buddhist masters and undertook the rigorous study of Indian classical dance. The Buddhist teachings, along with her ongoing love of dance sustained her as she experienced heart-rending challenges along the way.

Throughout this engaging and courageous tale, Arlyn never wavers from looking inward, facing her demons, and using adversity as a path to develop greater wisdom and compassion. It is a redemptive tale of love and loss that will leave no reader unmoved.

Sing Along to the History of the 1950's and 60's through Popular Song, Wednesday, June 27, 6:30 p.m.

Join New York Blues Hall of Fame inductee, Marc Black, for a musical tour through these two historically defining decades. You'll sing along with wonderful songs as diverse as Itsy Bitsy, Teeny Weeny Yellow Polka -Dot Bikini and Blowin' in the Wind; by artists ranging from Gene Autry to George Harrison. In addition to the music and discussion, this popular program features a slide show that's sure to slide you right back in time. Marc will also perform his own group's top forty hit from 1967...
