

# 10 Steps to Researching the History of Your House

#### **Definition**

**Grantor** – the person selling the property **Grantee** – the person buying the property

### **Basic Research Strategy**

#### 1. Assessor's Office – Property data

- Access Franklin Assessor Database
- The Assessor's Office will provide links to field/property cards, assessment values and assessor maps. It also provides the most recent book and page number to the deed of your house.

### 2. Registry of Deeds

- http://www.NorfolkDeeds.org/ Deeds are indexed by name back to 1793.
- Deeds images are available online back to 1793. Earlier deeds are located in Suffolk County.
- Norfolk County Registry of Deeds is located at 649 High Street, Dedham, MA.
- Search first for yourself as **grantee** and then find the seller who is the **grantor**.
- Next search the indexes for the seller as the grantee and find the previous grantor. Continue this process for as far back as you can go.

### 3. Census Records (also Mass. State Census Records)

- o Find the occupants of your house in the census. Please note: the occupants might not be the owners!

#### 4. Probate

- You can find house/estate inventories and list of family members in wills.
- Norfolk County Probate Court is located at 35 Shawmut Road, Canton, MA. Probate records available at this location for 1793 present
- Pre-1793 probate records are located in Suffolk County.

#### 5. Mass. Vital Records

- Provide birth/marriage/death dates and locations.
- Names of parents
- Available from FamilySearch.org, Ancestry.com, www.AmericanAncestors.org.

### 7. Massachusetts Historic Commission Inventory Sheets (State & Local)

- Check database online <a href="http://mhc-macris.net/">http://mhc-macris.net/</a> The database contains a complete index of historical properties. Full pdf versions of some may be found at the website.
- Check your local town hall, historical society or library for printed copies of inventory sheets.

### 8. City Directories & Residents Lists

- City Directories are available online at the major database sites like Ancestry.com
- Resident Lists may be available in Local History Room at local libraries or Town Hall.

#### 9. Tax Records

- Value of property through the years with basic descriptions of buildings or land
- Check your local library, Town Hall or Archive.org for Town Annual Reports which contain the tax records

## 10. Newspapers

Many old newspapers are available online through Ancestry.com, MyHeritage.com, NEHGS, GenealogyBank.com, Newspapers.com, Boston Public Library, the American Antiquarian Society (Worcester). #### 11. Photos and Miscellaneous Items

Be sure to check the Franklin Historical Museum for old photos of your home, old maps and other miscellaneous information.
