## Take & Make Resin Bookmarks!

## **Materials Provided:**

- Epoxy Resin
  - Part A
- GlovesTweezers

• Tassel

Dried Flowers

- Glitter
- Part BBookmark Mold
- Mixing Cup
- Popsicle Stick

## **Materials Provided:**

• Scissors



Directions

- Before You Start:
  - Make sure all your materials and tools are ready, clean, dust-free, and dry.
  - The resin (Part A) and hardener (Part B) should be at room temperature.
    - Colder temperatures can cause bubbles in the final product, longer curing times, and cloudy resin.
    - Suggested room temperature is 77°F I wouldn't stress too much about the exact room temperature, but if it's a day or in a room where the A/C is blowing it might not be ideal working conditions.
  - You want to be sure you are working on a level surface.
    - It is very difficult to move the mold after you pour the resin. Wherever your working should be someplace you can leave the mold to sit while it hardens
- Mixing the Resin:
  - Wearing gloves combine Part A and Part B into the provided mixing cup.
  - Mix thoroughly for a full 3 minutes with the popsicle stick.
  - Be sure to scrape the sides and bottom of the cup as you go to make sure everything is combined.

- Creating Your Bookmark:
  - Once fully mixed you will have 45 minutes to pour and work with your resin.
  - When pouring into the mold DO NOT scrape the sides of the cup to avoid adding in any unmixed product.
  - Pour the resin into the mold filling it up about halfway.
  - Add the provided dried flowers and/or glitter:
    - I read that it sometimes helps to wait until the resin gets to a gel-like state before adding the glitter, so I would suggest placing the flowers first.
    - Use scissors to trim the flowers into smaller pieces. The craft tweezers should help with handling the flowers and getting them into precise positions.
    - THE GLITTER LIKES TO COLLECT IN THE CENTER OF THE MOLD. THE LONGER YOU WAIT TO ADD THE GLITTER, THE BETTER YOUR CHANCES ARE TO AVOID IT GATTERING AS A CLUMP IN THE MIDDLE.



- Once satisfied with the add-ins, pour the remainder of the resin into the mold.
  - The flowers like to float to the top of the resin, so the tweezers were helpful in pushing the flowers down so they stay submerged.
- Cover your mold and set aside in a non-humid area and allow to fully cure for 72 hours.
- Once fully cured, carefully remove from the mold and add your tassel!
