The YMCA's Diabetes Prevention Program

and the Medicare Diabetes Prevention Program, is currently enrolling for spring classes. Due to the current state of the pandemic, classes will be offered both virtually and in-person. The virtual classes will meet either via Zoom or conference call, and in-person classes will meet at the YMCA and will follow the CDC protocol for group gatherings.

This program is designed to support adults with prediabetes in reducing their risk for developing

type 2 diabetes. This is accomplished through 25 sessions that follow a Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)-approved curriculum in the CDC's Diabetes Prevention Recognition Program. In a welcoming, smallgroup environment, participants work together with a Y-USA trained Lifestyle Coach to learn about eating healthier and increasing their physical activity. This program is offered as a covered benefit by Medicare Part B and some Medicare Advantage Providers.***

Research by the National Institutes of Health has shown that programs like the YMCA's Diabetes Prevention Program can reduce the number of new cases of type 2 Diabetes by 71% in adults over age 60.

Information & Referral

MassHealth Buy-in Program, also called Medicare Savings Program, will pay for the Part B monthly premium, \$148.50 per month. The Buy-In program can also help pay some of your out-of-pocket costs of Medicare, and get Medicare Part B for people who only have Medicare Part A. If you are in a Buy-In program, you will also be automatically enrolled in the Medicare Part D Extra Help program, through Social Security, which can help with pharmacy costs.

The "Are You Ok?" Program

is a daily telephone reassurance program offered by the Sheriff's Office in partnership with Fallon Ambulance. Each morning, enrolled seniors receive a call to check on their well-being. If an individual fails to respond or requires assistance, staff notifies their family, necessary, local police and/or emergency services. This program is offered free of charge to Norfolk County residents and has saved the lives of a number of seniors. The automated call takes approximately 24 seconds monitored by a Norfolk Sheriff Deputy Sheriff or Fallon Ambulance Individuals may determine how many days a week the call is placed and may suspend calls when they know they will be away from home.
