Town Department Re-entry Update

Based on <u>Governor Baker's Step 2 of Phase 3</u> anticipated Executive Order released on September 29th, 2020, the Franklin Town and School Administration offices, as well as all Franklin public buildings will continue to be closed to public traffic unless noted below. The administrative offices remain at 50% staff occupancy on site, and the remainder of employees are continuing to work remotely.

Here are the latest updates on town services:

- The Most recent Town of Franklin case data as of November 2, 2020 is here.
- The Recreation Department is proud to be offering a variety of Winter programs. - The Municipal Building at 355 East Central Street will reopen to public access for the first time since the declared state of emergency. All Town Departments within the Municipal Building have staff representation in the office and overall staff is at 50% capacity of all office space.
 - The public will only have access to the first floor of the Municipal Building (Town Clerk, Planning, Building, Health and Conservation).
 - Face coverings must be worn in the building at all times and a full contact tracing questionnaire will be required for entry.
 - If you need to meet with a staff member from another department please call or email the respective department/staff to schedule a time for the most expedient service. It is not required to have an appointment.
 - The Municipal Building drive-thru window will continue to be open for service during regular <u>Municipal Building business hours</u>. The Town encourages every resident to continue to use our online payment platforms at <u>Unibank</u> for Property Tax, Water, Sewer and Trash bills and <u>Viewpoint Online Permitting</u> for online permits and licenses. Please call the respective department for assistance. No Cash will be accepted.

- The Library is working diligently to prepare the library for in-person services including
 installing plexiglass, reconfiguring seating to maintain social distancing, establishing
 directional markings to control traffic, as well as obtaining needed PPE. Opening day will be
 after the Thanksgiving Holiday. We will have more guidance on re-opening soon.
- The Temporary Town Clerk and staff have been working tirelessly to make the 2020 Election season run smoothly. <u>Election Information can be found here</u>.

Public Works

The <u>DPW</u> crews are fully operational and will be working independently following employee safety guidelines. The DPW Administration Building remains at 50% staff capacity. DPW staff are available for on site meetings, by appointment only and must be outside the DPW building. For all in person meetings, face coverings are mandatory, social distancing is mandatory and proper respect and hygiene toward the town staff is required.
